Special Olympics Pennsylvania's Eastern Polar Plunge Celebrates 11 Years!

Philadelphia Eagles' Rodney McLeod, 95.7 BEN-FM's Matt Cord, and Hundreds to Plunge

Norristown, PA – January 10, 2019 – The 11th annual Eastern Polar Bear Plunge benefitting Special Olympics Pennsylvania (SOPA), presented by Aerotek and The Wawa Foundation will be held on Saturday, January 26, 2019 at Neshaminy State Park, located at 3401 State Road in Bensalem, PA. Registration opens at 9:30 a.m. and the plunge will take place at 12 noon. This year's plunge will welcome Philadelphia Eagles Safety & Super Bowl Champion Rodney McLeod as the Honorary Polar Plunge Captain. Rodney will be on site to host the costume contest, sign autographs (in small tent to the left of the main registration tent), take photos and cheer on participants as they exit the icy cold water!

The event will feature hundreds of brave souls who will jump into the frigid waters of the Delaware River and be "freezin' for a reason" in support of nearly 20,000 Special Olympics athletes. Friends and family members are welcome to enjoy activities and entertainment at Plunge Town in the morning while waiting for plungers to take a dip in the cold Delaware River. The fun filled day will include tailgating (no alcohol is allowed in the State Park), music courtesy of BEN-FMS promo team, a costume contest, and complimentary refreshments courtesy of Wawa.

The 2019 Eastern Polar Plunge will also include a "Battle of the Badges," where law enforcement, Fire Departments and EMS teams battle it out in a fundraising challenge like no other. The ultimate goal is to acquire the sought after "Battle of the Badges" traveling trophy, bragging rights, and the ultimate reward is assisting thousands of Special Olympics athletes continue to participate in Special Olympics activities at no cost to them or their family. Last year, The Centurians Bucks County, comprised of members from the Philadelphia Police Department won the title. The Centurians Bucks County raised over \$10,000 for Special Olympics Pennsylvania.

The Polar Plunge invites participants of all ages (under 18 requires parent or guardian signature) to take a dip in the "cool" waters of the Delaware River. Plungers can take the plunge on their own with a minimum pledge of \$50 or, better yet, join a group of 10 friends and/or colleagues to form a Plunge Team with a \$500 pledge goal. All plungers are asked to raise the \$50 minimum pledge to receive an official 2019 long sleeved Polar Plunge t-shirt, but are eligible to earn additional prizes as their pledges increase. Additionally, since jumping into a freezing river is not for everyone, participants can choose to register for the event as a "Too Chicken to Plunge" participant. Corporate, school and community teams are also welcome to set up a tent and hang a team banner in support of SOPA.
